

YOUR VOTE IS IMPORTANT TO THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF WOMEN AND WOMEN'S ISSUES

For about 100 years we have had the vote and the right to be elected to office. Why haven't more women's issues been addressed?

The power is not held by the individually elected members of Congress. Power comes with greater numbers of women who work in unison toward a common goal. Women are more than 50% of our population. Yet, in 2023 there was the highest representation of women in the House of Representatives, 128 or 29% are women. Two years ago was the highest representation of women in the Senate, 25 or ½ of the members.

According to the American Journal of Political Science Congressional women sponsor more bills than men. Those bills tend to focus on benefits for women and children, education, health, civil rights and poverty. Women fought for women's health coverage, sexual harassment rules in the military, inclusion of women in medical trials, child care vouchers in welfare reform, protections from domestic violence and pay equity.

Approximately 4% of bills proposed in Congress become law. That drops to 2% for bills related to women's issues. When these bills are sponsored by women, the success rate further falls to just 1%

Nothing is ever truly black or white or totally right or totally wrong. Solutions that last beyond the moment incorporate ideas from those representing a variety of perspectives. Women govern differently than men. They tend to be more collaborative and bipartisan. Just think what could happen if the majority of those making our laws believed that solutions required compromise.

November 5 is just around the corner. We have the power to influence the future just by voting.










CALIFORNIA ELECTION RESULTS
