We supported 60-Projects, 5,040 Volunteer Hours, Donated \$60,285 gave \$44,352 In-kind Donations, Spent \$1,385 and Raised \$6,285 Dollars. Our numbers are down this year due to the fact we did not host our annual Casino Night Scholarship Fundraiser in 2023, this was so that we would not have an overlap from October 2022 when the event was last held, to February 2023.

At age of 60 Ellen Browning Scripps moved to San Diego, California in 1891. As woman with an independent fortune, she established her own home in La Jolla, California in 1897. Ellen began a new life as a philanthropist. She believed in education and free speech; she was an advocate of women's suffrage and women's' clubs; biology interested her; she abhorred discrimination and privilege and favored temperance and world peace. She disliked the word "philanthropist," and referred to her gifts as investments.

After founding the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, she founded Scripps College, Scripps Hospital and Scripps Clinic. She built the La Jolla Women's Club, the La Jolla Library, and the Children's Pool. She provided scholarships to The Bishops School. She purchased Torrey Pines and other lands and donated them to the public as parks. She made substantial contributions to the San Diego Zoo, and she donated sums to many religious institutions without regard to denomination. She commissioned works by local artists and architects, including Irving Gill, and provided gifts for the publication of scientific books, especially books documenting the natural history of San Diego.

Let's Talk Public Safety Program – February 28th

Created by the City in partnership with the Los Angeles County sheriff's and fire departments, the Let's Talk Public Safety (LTPS) program is aimed at engaging with the community and raising awareness about all things public-safety related, from emergency preparedness to crime prevention.

2024 Public Safety Seminar

The City and local public safety agencies are teaming up to host a seminar that will feature a panel of speakers from the City and the Los Angeles County sheriff's and fire departments.

Organized as part of the City's Let's Talk Public Safety campaign, the 90-minute seminar will cover a variety of topics that include historical crime trends, wildfire and home fire prevention, personal safety and crime prevention, and the City's homelessness response.

To accommodate as many interested residents as possible, the seminar will be held at four different locations and on four different dates with the same information covered each time.
